In his opening address to the UN talks on Climate Change, secretary-general Ban Ki-Moon warned the dreams of humanity hung in the balance.

"To ride this storm we need all hands on deck," he said.

- to mobilise political will for a universal and meaningful climate agreement next year in Paris;
- to generate ambitious steps to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and strengthen resilience.
