SYNOD ECUMENICAL OFFICER

As your Ecumenical Officer I have become familiar with some of the watchwords used by denominational EOs and Churches Together in England (CTE) who provide our training. Among these is the phrase 'receptive ecumenism.' As the CTE website explains, 'Receptive ecumenism is essentially very simple. Instead of asking what other Church traditions need to learn from us, we ask what our tradition needs to learn from them.' 'It challenges us not to think of what others might benefit from receiving from us, but instead invites us to recognise our needs and to put ourselves in the place of being a recipient.' There is wisdom in this approach which can help overcome the undoubted tensions that result from working with people who differ from ourselves, both within the United Reformed Church and beyond. How can we affirm what is good in the other person, the other group, the other church? Having spent more than four decades now in contexts that include inhabiting the household of other denominations alongside the URC, it is in those times when I have learned to appreciate the gifts in others that the most rewarding steps have been taken. This September I begin my last year of URC stipendiary ministry, and both now and beyond that horizon I hope to uphold receptive ecumenism 'which has the potential to transform how we listen and relate as churches – learning from each other and recognising that we all have gifts to share.' It is an attitude that helps to fulfil Jesus' prayer, "That they may be one…that the world may believe…." (John 17:21).
