Recent Discussion Items, Events etc. - From CYDO - Tom Hackett

Mental Health First Aid

Youth MHFA training has continued to be offered. Recently delivered courses have included training for EM1 ministers at Westminster College and at Christ Church URC Chelmsford. Over the coming months we will focus on delivering the half day "Youth Mental Health Aware" course and are looking for local churches within Synod to host this training. MHFA England are currently updating the 2 day Youth MHFA course, which is due to launch in January 2025. Hopefully there will be new training dates from the end of January.

Youth Residential

The Joint Synod Youth Residential took place from 30th May – 2nd June at Whitemoor Lakes Activity Centre in Staffordshire. The programme included a mixture of outdoor activities (climbing, zip wire, raft building, canoeing), worship and workshops on the theme of "Story, Story, Story". 12 young people attended the event, including 2 participants from Southern Synod. The leadership team also included 4 young leaders from URC Youth age range. This is the second year that we have ran this event together with Thames North Synod. Feedback from participants was very positive. During October half term we will be holding a day event where participants will be invited to gather and evaluate the event. The dates for 2025 Youth Residential are Thursday 29th May to Sunday 1st June 2025

Children & Youth Friendly Church Scheme

Recent presentations have been made at Reigate Park and Kingston URC. There are currently several churches working through the CYFC Scheme with the support of Synod CYDO.

Greenbelt Festival – Youth Venues

This year was another positive year in Greenbelt Youth Venues. The youth engagement team facilitated the provision of the Den and Engine venues which were open throughout the festival for young people aged 12-17. The Den was a relaxed space where young people could hang out, with a range of activities available such as board games, craft activities and a café serving drinks, sweets and refreshments. The engine was a programmed venue, which included a range of workshops and activities featuring artists and contributors from the main festival programme. The venues were open throughout the festival from 10am-11pm each day. Positive feedback was received from young people attending the Den and Engine venues, as well as from parents/carers and from volunteers within the youth engagement team. The Youth Engagement Team is made up of volunteers, with 3 members of the CYDO+ team (Judy Harris, Phil Ray and Tom Hackett) acting as team leaders and venue managers. The volunteers included members from URC youth, including current URC Youth Assembly Moderator Heather Moore from Southern Synod.

Youth Worker Project

Here is a brief reminder summary of the project. Aimed to find a way of practically supporting youth work in local churches. Project aims to support

churches in identifying young people from community to take on part time work within the local church. Idea came from fact that there are many young people on periphery of church who are sometimes forgotten and disengaged. This has been applied at Tolworth URC with employment of part time Youth Worker and has been successful. The technique helps to identify, support and nurture young people within the community. Tom has seen a growth in the youth workers confidence at Tolworth URC between visits.
