Minister's Spring School 2025!

The annual Spring School was a wonderful gathering of 32 ministers from around the Synod. A few rose early for aerobics and running led by Lesley Charlton, and many stayed up late into the evening for meaningful conversation and healing laughter. Our chaplain, Sue Chapman, led us in creative morning prayer and reflection and the new TDO for Southern, Charisa Hunter-Crump, led us in worship and communion on the final day.

Our guest speaker was Rev. Dr. Susan Durber, a minister in the URC and the World Council of Churches' President from Europe. Her topic was "Who is Jesus? Bible Study and Reflections in the year of the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea." Through storytelling, art, film, poetry, and prose, she reminded us of the complexity of answering that question, the diversity of approaches that have been taken, and the importance of exploring the question with mind, heart, and spirit, for our own faith journeys, and for the life of our congregations.

News from the Training and Development Officer

First, a big thank you to everyone I have met so far in the Southern Synod who have welcomed me so warmly. I am loving being in ministry with all of you! I also want to thank my predecessor, Andy Twilley, for all the good work he did among you for so many years.

I have been meeting with everyone I can to fully understand my role as TDO. Here's a summary for you.

- Support **EM1** students as they move through their four years of college.
- Support newly ordained/commissioned **EM2** Ministers and CRCWs in their new ministry settings to reflect on their ministries and advance to **EM3** after a period of three years.
- Support **EM3** Ministers and CRCWs with their training and development needs, including their annual Continuing Education, their required trainings in Safeguarding and Safer Sacred Spaces, and their pursuit of a sabbatical every ten years.
- Plan and help lead Ministers Spring School with the Spring School Planning Team.
- Support students seeking Assembly Accredited Lay Preaching certification through their application process and two years of college.
- Support AALPs with their training and development needs, including their annual Continuing Education and their required trainings in Safeguarding and Safer Sacred Spaces.
- Offer year-long training for students seeking Locally Recognised Worship Leader certification.
- Offer semi-annual trainings in worship and preaching for all preachers and worship leaders.
- Conduct multiple Elders Trainings throughout the year in a variety of accessible locations, in cooperation with our Training Consultant, Mark Rigby.

- Conduct **Elders Sacraments Trainings** needed to ensure every congregation has one or two Elders trained and certified to preside at sacraments should no one else be available.
- Conduct trainings for **Interim Moderators and Visionary Companions** as needed.
- Host a **Synod-wide Stepwise Learning Cohort** for those interested in companionship whilst taking that online training.
- **Support congregations** in the Synod and **Area Meetings** by visiting to get to know you and the ministries in which you are involved.
- **Be available to preach** once or twice a month around the Synod.

Synod Area Administrator - Surrey and Sussex Synod Area

Part time - 15 hours per week. £14 per hour (£10,920 pa).

Southern Synod are looking for an administratively efficient and personable individual to support the Synod Area leaders and the churches, while maintaining a high level of confidentiality. The role is predominantly home-based and the nature of the work will involve a degree of flexibility in time allocation during the week, including occasional evening or weekend work.

Main responsibilities:

1. Administer Area and related meetings:
 - a. Preparing and circulating agendas and taking minutes
 - b. Organising venues
 - c. Completing follow up actions at the direction of the meeting Chair
1. Liaise with churches in maintaining Synod Area databases and records, and promoting communications.
2. Assist and monitor churches in maintaining compliance with statutory and URC expectations.
3. Support administratively other initiatives as agreed with the Synod Area Officers. In all the above, to liaise with other URC staff and ecumenical colleagues where required.

With roots in the 16th-century Reformation, and particularly in the theology of John Calvin, the World Communion of Reformed Churches (WCRC) dates its organisational history to London in 1875, and has been unifying churches over the course of its existence. 

We'll be reflecting on:


