A message about our Moderator, Revd Bridget Banks

It is with great sadness that we share the news that Revd Bridget Banks, our Moderator, has had to take early retirement on health grounds. We give thanks for all that Bridget has done in her ministry with us, serving in a local

pastorate, various committees and as Moderator to the Synod. She has served with compassion, deep pastoral care, and always sought to do her best. Hearts have been touched by her kindness and lives impacted by her service. We are grateful for all the ways in which she has shared the gospel message of love through her calling and faithfulness. She will be missed.

Bridget has said "it has been an immense privilege to have served in this role, and it has been an honour to work alongside Ministers, Elders, CRCWs, members, lay leaders, volunteers and all connected to the United Reformed Church. My gratitude goes to all the colleagues who I have been fortunate to work with. I am also grateful for their prayers, support and encouragement."

"Certificates of Eligibility" - Ministers wishing to transfer to the United Reformed Church

Ministers of other churches wishing to transfer to the United Reformed Church can seek a [Certificate of Eligibility](#) to come on to the Roll of Ministers of the United Reformed Church. Applications should be received by 31st July 2025, with initial interviews via Zoom in August. Successful candidates will be invited to attend an in-person Assessment Conference from 30th October – 1st November 2025 in Cambridge, UK.

Applications are welcome from ministers who are members of churches that are either a member of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland, the Council for World Mission, the World Communion of Reformed Churches. Your application should evidence experience in local pastorate ministry (minimum 5 years) in a leadership role; intercultural competence; understanding/experience of working in multi-church pastorates/settings and a readiness and willingness to serve in any part of the UK

Congratulations to Billingshurst URC

Congratulations to Billingshurst URC who are celebrating their 210th anniversary of the church in Billingshurst, West Sussex. To mark the occasion a special service was held on Sunday 15th June followed by a lunch for the members of the church, friends from our Area Ministry sister church and area dignitaries.

Billingshurst URC currently has twenty-two members who are very active in worship and are an important part of their community volunteering their time and support to local activities such as the 'Dementia Café' which they host twice a month. The café has grown in number of visitors who are enjoying a warm welcome by the church, their volunteers and also the delicious homemade refreshments. The church secretary, Brenda Homden is also part of the local Street Pastor team for the village and Chairperson for the local Churches Together.

Two and half years ago, the church decided to begin renovation work to restore the church to its original glory. After a lot of hard work and determination it now looks wonderful again and with the new chairs and carpet, the sanctuary looks fresh and welcoming.



The Grove Centre, Sydenham transforms!

The Grove Centre Church in Sydenham, South London officially opened its newly refurbished Grove Centre House on Friday 6th June. The Church, which is a combined Baptist and United Reformed Church, has

always endeavoured to be a “A Place For People”.

While having a full programme of both Church and community activities the Church recognised the limitations in its adjoining Georgian style, listed House Hall and offices. The building was inaccessible, tired and failing to meet the direct needs of our many user groups.

The project, which has been 16 years in the planning and delivery, has transformed the facility into a bright, airy and fully accessible space with a lift providing access to offices and meeting spaces on the first floor. The project has cost in excess of £750,000, with money being raised through a number of charitable grants, including input from both denominations, local fund-raising efforts and gifts and legacies from within its own fellowship.

The Right Honourable Ellie Reeves M.P. performed the ceremony, along with representatives of the London Borough of Lewisham, the professional team and builders, current users of the spaces and members of the Church. Ellie Reeves M.P. welcomed the huge improvements to the building since the last time she was here. She commented on how the refurbishment has turned the building into a welcoming place for use by local groups and organisations who do so much to help make strong communities and help foster a positive community spirit which she is proud we have in Sydenham.

She went on to say “Wonderful to be at the grand re-opening of the Grove Centre House Hall. The Grove Centre has been at the heart of Sydenham for more than 50 years and I know it’ll continue to serve our community for many years to come”.

1. Elders Trainings

Since I wrote to you back in June, Mark Rigby and I have held three Elders' Trainings. One in Reigate Park for Banstead, Dorking, Redhill and Reigate Elders. One in Oxted for the Surrey, Sussex and Kent Borders Pastorate, Caterham, Marsh Green, Oxted, and the Moat, and East Grinstead Elders. trainings going forward.

If your congregation is interested in having one or two Elders trained in presiding at the Sacraments, please discuss this among yourselves to nominate those Elders and then let me know. No current trainings are planned as these are organised as there is a need.

5. Synod-wide Stepwise Learning Cohort

Finally, I hope to begin an online cohort to work through the Stepwise programme together for those interested in companionship whilst taking that online training. This may start in the Autumn, or possibly the new year. Please let me know if you are interested.

National Churches Trust Survey

The National Churches Trust survey of places of churches has been extended to close on **Sunday 13 July**. The survey is <https://www.research.net/r/NationalChurches2025> – it takes about 30 minutes to complete.

The purpose of the survey is to demonstrate to Government and policymakers the important role that churches play in their communities. It is particularly timely, given the current pressure on public spending and, in particular, the recent cuts to the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme. *The more individual churches that complete it, the more robust and valuable the overall data will be.*

Changes in Southern Synod

We remember Revd Alex Mabbs, Revd Alwyn Knight and Ralph Bradshaw

We are very sad to share the news of the passing of three important members, past and present, of Southern Synod.

Revd Alex Mabbs sadly passed away on Friday 13th June, after a short illness. Many within Southern Synod will remember Alex and all his hard work and dedication as minister in Southern serving Hounsom Memorial, Central Hove & Portslade from 2006 – 2014 before moving to Brighthelm URC & Community Centre until 2021.

Revd Alwyn Knight sadly died on Sunday 22nd June, having struggled with health and mobility issues for some time. Alwyn served at Trinity, Poplar 1965-67; Goodmayes 1967-73; John Knox, Stepney & Stepney Meeting 1973-76; Stepney Meeting 1976-79; Western Road, Romford 1979-95; Bishops Stortford 1995-2003. He had also served with the Ecumenical Accompaniment Programme in Palestine and Israel and had volunteered with the Christian Peacemaker Teams in the West Bank town of Hebron. Alwyn retired to Tenterden with his wife Enid.

Ralph Bradshaw died on 23rd June. Ralph was a committed servant and Treasurer of Hythe URC. He was also well-known more widely in the Synod as a Lay Preacher around East Kent and amongst the local Methodists, an Interim Moderator and as a member of various Synod Committees over the years.

We hope you will join the whole Synod in remembering Alex, Alwyn and Ralph, and keep their families in your thoughts and prayers.
